








OPEN SPACE

- Led initiative for referendum on open space tax- Two open space taxes passed
- Created the belief that the Chase Tract could be preserved and helped create entity to fund it—FOHOS -- It was successful
- Became officially organized as a 501(c 4)—Still Going Strong 25 years
